

## Refurbished Kitchen

The kitchen in the village hall has undergone a transformation. Within the same four walls there is more storage space so more of the catering equipment is to hand in the kitchen instead of traipsing back and forth to the cupboard at the back of the hall.

There is a new cooker and fridge and the window has been replaced. All-in-all a splendid job thanks to Tim & Mary Scarff and their team of helpers.

## Hire the Village Hall

You might like to consider using the Village Hall for your next function. You can also hire extra tables and chairs and/or cutlery for your event at home for a donation. The floor area is roughly 7 by 11 metres – plenty of room for children to run around in, for example. For private functions we charge **£7.50/hour from April–Sept** and **£9/hour from Oct–March**. Any reasonable setting-up time is free.

## Show a film

There is an overhead projector in the Village Hall so that films can be screened from DVDs. Alternatively, the same equipment can be used for a slide show run from a computer.



### Cyan Traces

In 1973, after playing professionally for many years, trombonist Dave Amis returned home to take up a post as a Brass Teacher for the Norfolk County Music Services. In 2009 he became aware of Ivars Galeniekis and was attracted to his 'European Approach'. So began discussions about the possibility of forming a group. Soon they both agreed that Tom Harris would be their preferred pianist and so he was invited to join. Then a long period elapsed because they were very uncertain over the drum chair – was there someone who could play quietly without losing the feel? Miraculously Ivars found Alex Best on a gig in Ipswich. Our prayer was answered.

Dave sensed that it needed one other ingredient for the magic to happen. Upon hearing Holly sing it was immediately apparent to him that she had all the qualities to make the mix an intriguing one – so Cyan Traces was born.

Reports in the **North Norfolk News** have said: 'This innovative event attracted an audience of at least 130 people who experienced exquisite arrangements by Dave Amis: *A Lovely Way to Spend an Evening*, *My Favourite Things*, *Cry Me a River*, *Comes Love*, and *It's All in the Game*, to name but a few. The vocal interpretations by Holly Graham were so sincere, so articulate and emotionally expressive. This quintet, all skilled in exciting improvisational skills, brought about a night to remember.'

'Veteran second-generation band leader and music mentor Dave Amis uses his seven decades of musical experiences and influences to breathe new life into old (and not so old) songs. He draws mostly from the great American jazz scene of the mid twentieth century but sprinkled with pop and classical influences.'


